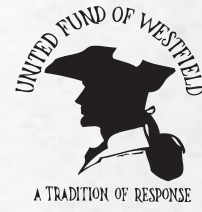

Letter from the President

This newsletter marks the launch of the 75th anniversary campaign of the Westfield United Fund. Looking over it, I think you will be amazed at how the fund has evolved to meet the changing needs of our community, from war relief programs in the 1940s to coordinating the community response to September 11, 2001. All told, the Westfield United Fund has provided over \$25 million of financial support to local not-for-profit agencies since our founding in 1937.



Today, the Westfield United Fund supports 19 social services agencies ranging from our newest member, CASA (Court Appointed Special Advocates) to our longest standing, the Westfield Y. It touches on every population in need, from children to seniors, the physically and developmentally impaired, low-income households and families in crisis.

This spring, WUF approved programs totaling \$485,000 by our member agencies. These allocations represented a 6.4% increase over last year and fulfilled almost 90% of the requests. Those needs continue, and our ability to meet them is directly related to your generosity.

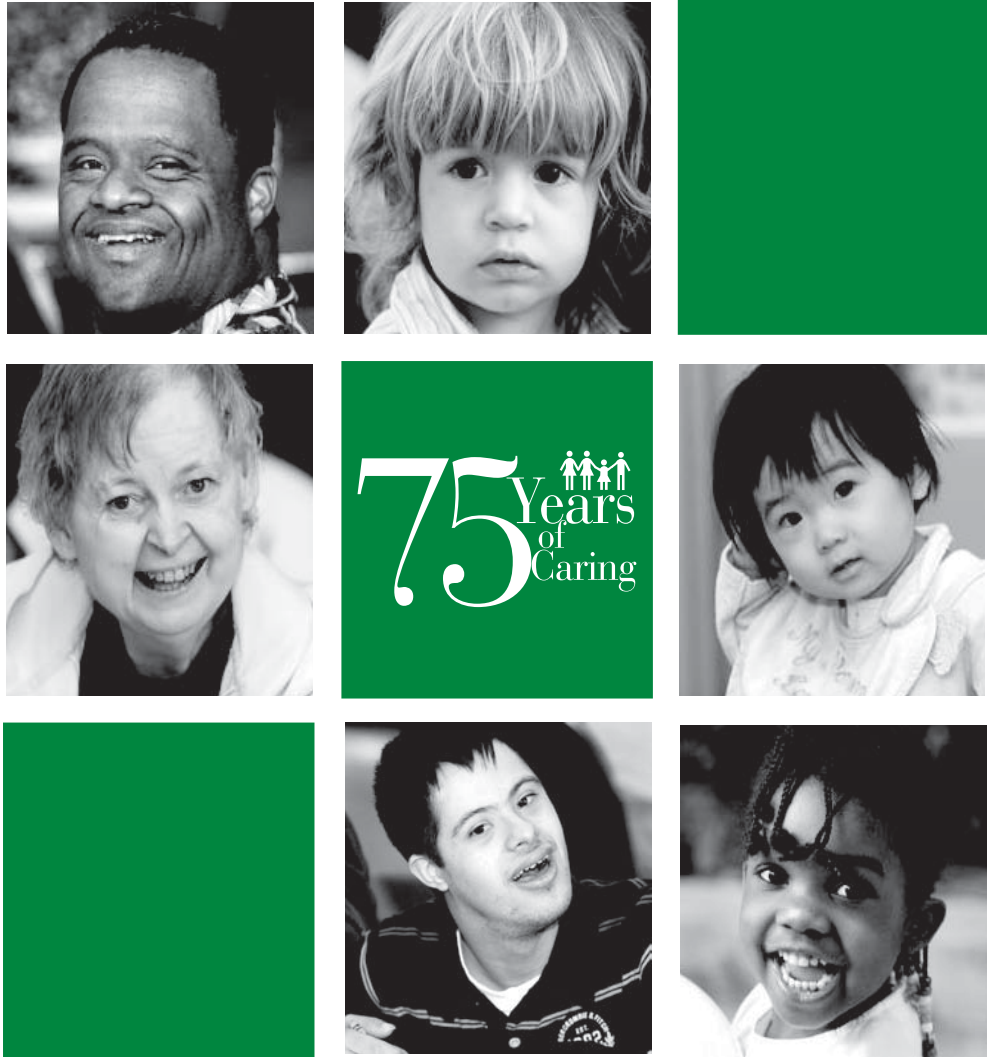

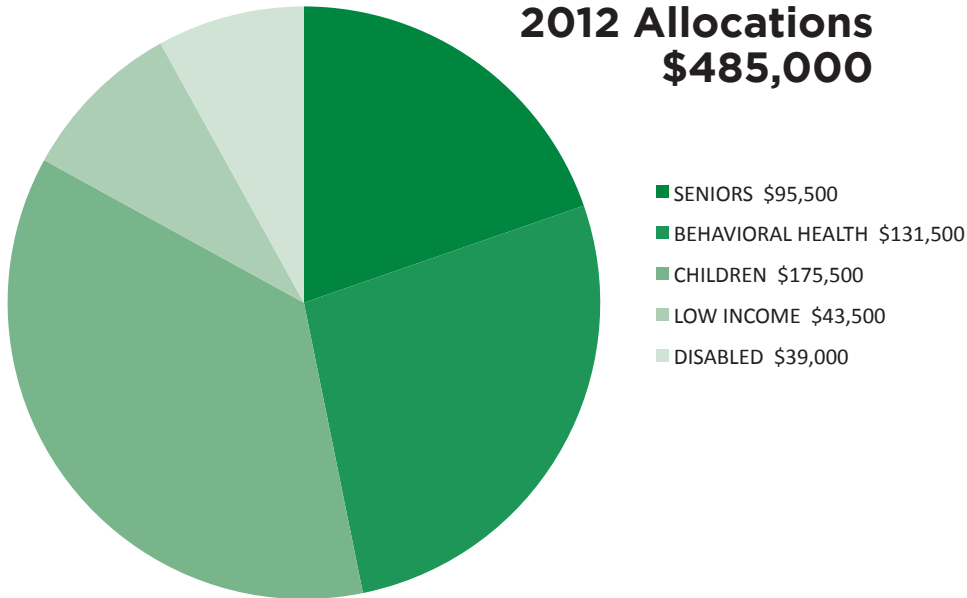
